B. When a person is caught driving drunk their vehicle seized, and they lose their license (Perkins, 2008).

If the driver refuses a chemical test it can result in two charges and their license being suspended.



C. A person driving with .08 grams of alcohol but less than .15 can be charged with a Class C misdemeanor, 0.15 can be charged with a Class A misdemeanor.

### **III. Collisions**
